

BYLAW NO. 1-80

A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH AND CONTROL A CEMETERY

The council of the Village of Lang in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows: -

1. That part of the S W quarter of section 23 township 11, range 18, west of the 2nd meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan, acquired by the village for cemetery purposes as approved by the Registrar under The Cemeteries Act shall be and is hereby appropriated as a public cemetery to be called the Lang cemetery.

2. Subject to the provisions of section 11 hereof no burial shall be made in the Lang cemetery unless a licence has been first obtained in accordance with this bylaw.

3. Upon written application therefor and upon payment of the fees hereinafter set forth, the secretary treasurer of this village, shall, issue a licence for a burial lot for the burial of a deceased person in the Lang cemetery.

4. The following sums shall be charged for licences and shall be paid by applicants at the time of selection: -

Single graves for adults five dollars
Single graves for children five dollars
Block of two lots ten dollars
Block of three lots fifteen dollars
Block of four lots twenty dollars

5. No licensee of a lot shall allow any interment to be made therein for remuneration.

6. The licensee of a lot may, subject to the approval of the council, erect proper stones or monuments and cultivate trees, shrubs and plants thereon but no such tree or shrub shall be cut down or destroyed without the consent of the council.

7. If any tree or shrub, by means of its roots, branches or otherwise, becomes detrimental to an adjacent lot or avenue or dangerous or inconvenient, the council may direct the removal of such tree or shrub or parts thereof.

8. No one will be allowed to install grave covers made of cement, fibreglass or any other material in the Lang cemetery.

9. The council may remove any monument, enclosure or any inscription placed in or upon any lot which it deems to be improper or injurious to the appearance of the cemetery.

10. The licensees of lots and their families shall be allowed access to the grounds at all reasonable times and may improve their lots at such times.

11. No burial shall take place in the cemetery except when the caretaker or his agent is present.

12. The secretary treasurer shall keep an accurate record setting forth the name of the deceased person, the location of burial of such person and the date of burial.

13. No graves shall be opened and no disinterment shall take place unless a written permit is obtained from the Minister of Public Health.

14. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw, shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the general penalty bylaw of the village.
